Your membership is important to our club and we value what you bring to the table. Despite the challenges of COVID, we continue to navigate the new normal, work to meet our goals and fulfill the services our club is known for.

Our dues are quite low compared to other service clubs. Zonta International expects clubs to cover their operating costs with dues, and that all other income should be viewed as service dollars. This has not been the practice of our club. To keep our dues low, we have supplemented with happy dollars, quick dollars and proceeds from the garage sale and more recently, sales from Leaf's Treehouse. These club activities cover much of our operating costs.

For example, our 2020-21 club administrative costs **TOTAL = \$1656** including:

- storage unit (\$1020)
- P.O. Box Rental (\$106)
- Chamber dues (\$100)
- Yearbook printing (\$150)

- Website maintenance (\$140)
- Licensing & Fees (\$50)
- Treasurer bonding (\$90)

All committee expenses including guest lunches, Z clubs, all standing committees etc. are covered by the garage sale, happy dollars and quick dollars/Leaf sales. Your support of the garage sale, happy dollars and quick dollars is vital to support our committee work.

If we rely on club dues only, this is a snapshot of what our income is:

\$24 x 60 members = \$1440

\$24 x 70 members = \$1680 (we currently have 68 members)

\$24 x 100 members = \$2400

The more members we have the more of everything we have including funds, energy, ideas, expertise and more!

Bottom line...each of you is vital to help our club be successful and to continue to do the good work we have been known for, **since 1953!** So, watch for renewal letters in late March. 
The Club has supported and partnered with many local service organizations and programs such as:




# Q2 If available would you attend an evening club meeting? Most likely a program meeting.





### **Volunteer Opportunity**

Some Zonta members, who are also members of Coos County Friends of Public Health (CCFoPH), have been volunteering at the Covid vaccination clinics which have been held by Coos Health & Wellness at the Coos Bay Fire Station and also the Coos County Fairgrounds in Myrtle Point. These clinics would not be possible without the large group of volunteers who are working for the health of our community. Volunteers from the Friends serve during these drive-through clinics in the role of "post vaccination" monitoring." This is the 15-minute wait period after getting a shot when an allergic reaction is most likely to happen, and medical assistance needed. The Friends volunteers work outside, rain or shine, in the parking lot. Other volunteers from the Medical Reserve Corps (MRC) and the Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) are also assisting. The MRC volunteers help by giving shots or assisting with paperwork, and the CERT volunteers assist with traffic control. **Dr. Debi Groom** administered vaccines at the last clinic on March 6!

Did you know, prior to Covid 19, four out of ten businesses in the United States were owned by women? The number of women-owned businesses in the U.S. increased between 1972 and 2018, growing from 402,000 to 12.3 million, a rise from 4.6% of all firms to 40%. Per the website SmallBizGenius, this data demonstrates the impact women have had on the economy and their communities, creating jobs, and generating revenue. Our community has also experienced a substantial growth of women-owned businesses. Many of those women have joined the Zonta Club of the Coos Bay Area to network with others who enjoy sharing their time providing needed services to women in our community.

Membership in Zonta offers women and men an opportunity to work together on service projects.
