President Alissa's Message ~


Hello All!

This year on Zonta Rose Day and International Women's Day March 8th we give tribute to individuals who have empowered us personally or the women in our community. On March 17th at our club program meeting, we will honor Coos County Chief Deputy District Attorney Jody Newby. Newby epitomizes the Zonta Rose Day theme of "Building a Better World for Women and Girls."

International Women's Day is a Global Day of Celebration to celebrate the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The United Nations established International Women's Day in1975 to celebrate the rights of women and international peace. However, its history stretches back to the early 1900s, when women's organizations around the world used the day to rally support for their causes: from the universal suffrage movement to obtain the vote, to the protest of poor working conditions. In 1999 Zonta International officially designated International Women's Day (IWD) as Zonta Rose Day.

The March 17th meeting will take place at the Coos History Museum's Sprague Gallery, 12:00 -1:00 PM. A Zoom option will be available. A light sandwich lunch will be available for purchase. This is a great meeting to invite

March 17th Program Speaker

Jody Newby was born in Anchorage, Alaska and currently lives in Bandon, Oregon with her husband Vance Newby, a Chief in the U.S. Coast Guard, and her fourteen-year-old son Sebastian. She graduated from Willamette University in 2001 with a degree in Politics where she started an exchange program to Iceland to study women in politics. After college, she worked at the Alaska Women's Resource Center.

In 2002, she traveled back to Iceland as a Fulbright Scholar to study Kvennalistinn, a women's political party. Jody graduated from Seattle University in 2008 with a Juris Doctorate and later began working as a prosecutor in



Cowlitz County Washington, where she remained for over six years. In 2015, she and her son moved to Bandon to join her husband after he was stationed in Coos County. She currently works as the Chief Deputy District Attorney for Coos County and prosecutes major crimes, is a member of the South Coast Interagency Narcotics Team, the Coos County Crash Team, and the Major Crimes Team. Her passion is helping survivors of domestic violence and sexual abuse navigate the criminal justice system and see justice served.



INTERNATIONAL DAY OF EDUCATION 24 JANUARY 2023



Worldwide, 129 million girls are out of school, including 32 million of primary school age, 30 million of lower-secondary school age, and 67 million of upper-secondary school age.



The education of girls helps to break intergenerational cycles of poverty and disadvantage. When a girl stays in school, she increases her income-earning potential and her future is immediately brighter.

- Amelia Earhart Fellowship- awards up to 30 Fellowships of \$10,000 each to women pursuing Ph.D./doctoral degrees in aerospace engineering and space sciences.
- Jane M. Klausman Women in Business Scholarship- helps women pursuing undergraduate and master's degrees in business management with up to 37 scholarships of \$5,000 each annually. See page 3
- Women in STEM Scholarship- encourages women to pursue education in STEM through a pilot program, offering up to 32 awards of \$5,000.

In anticipation of reviewing the applications from local nonprofits for this year's Community 101 funds, the MHS Z club has had presentations at two meetings this month: one from the Coos Bay Police Resource Officer about the drug use he is seeing in our community, and the other from treatment providers (who are NOT applying for funds) who talked about the needs of those in recovery and the options available locally. Both presentations were well received by the members with many good questions asked and answered.



On the community service side, Z Club was asked to provide childcare on a Saturday (IN COQUILLE) by Greg Dalton. This was for a foster parent training co-sponsored by CASA and Every Child. Greg reported:

"The youth from Z-Club were amazing and so very helpful with the kids. They did art projects, played games, ran after the busy toddlers, and just showed love and attention to the kids. One of the younger kids has some developmental delays and is very busy and curious, he takes a lot of energy. They cared for him, snuggled him, and were just the best caregivers. I saw one of the youths helping a little girl blow her nose, on several occasions. I saw [them] get hugs from the kids; their presence was important, calming, and caring. I just got to say that I'm always so impressed by your Z-Club team! What was extra special about this event was that we had used your Community 101 funds [from last year] to purchase the emotional regulation kits that were given to foster parents at the event. The training covered how to use the kits and how they worked to help a child calm."
