#### **Women's History Month**


Throughout March, let's also remember the trailblazing women who paved the way for our opportunities

This month promises to be filled with celebration, reflection, and meaningful connections. I look forward to seeing you all at our Rose Day event and continuing our vital work together.



Our February program speaker was Zonta club member, **Debbie Kirby**, LCSW and co-owner of the **Coastal Center Counseling Service**. Debbie shared statistical trends impacting women's mental health, as well as an overview of ideas and available resource. We were all surprised the hear the highest rate of suicide among women is in the 40-55's age group.



Zonta club member, Rachel Espy Director of The

Safe Project was awarded a check from our Coos Bay Area Zonta Service Foundation for \$5,954. Our club donation will fund a new program at The SAFE Project, called SAFE2WORK. This is an incentive-based employment readiness program for survivors of domestic violence entering or reentering the workforce.

Members will recall our long-time club service project Dress Your Best. Dress Your Best began in 2004 as a service project of the Zonta New Member Committee lead by advisor Paula Bechtold. It later became a club service project, a half day seminar in partnership with the Bree's Foundation, designed for women

effected by domestic violence, drug addiction, on parole or probation, etc. The last seminar was held in 2019, as the scheduled April 2020 seminar was canceled during Covid. It's exciting to see our club financing will continue to improve women's lives through the SAFE2WORK program.

## International Women's Day and Zonta Rose Day by Genelle Hanken



Each year on March 8, Zonta joins the global community in celebrating International Women's Day, a global day to celebrate the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The United Nations established International Women's Day in 1975 to celebrate the rights of women and international peace. However, its history stretches back to the early 1900s, when women's organizations around the world used the day to rally support for their causes: from the universal suffrage movement to obtain the vote, to the protest of poor working conditions. In 1999 Zonta International officially designated International Women's Day (IWD) as Zonta Rose Day. The Yellow Rose was adopted as the symbol of Zonta in 1984 at the convention in Sydney, Australia.

Zonta Rose Day is a time to reflect and honor those individuals who are working toward gender equality and making a difference for women and girls in their communities. In recent years our club has honored Annie Pollard, marine biologist and co-owner of Seven Devil's Brewery in 2021, Tara Johnson Director of the Nancy Devereux Center in 2022 and Jody Newby Coos County Chief Deputy District Attorney and now a candidate for Coos County District Attorney, in 2023.

I was born in Torrance, California about a mile from the beach and I have always loved the water and the Pacific Ocean. The love of nature and all its beauty led to me owning Arabian horses and showing them as a teenager in Rolling Hills, California where I was raised.

As a young adult I traveled to Europe, took many classes, and decided to major in Child Psychology. At Chico State I met my husband. I never finished school because we opened one of the very first Micro-Breweries in the U.S., in the year 1984. Also, a brewpub 1990. The businesses were sold, and we traveled around the western part of the U.S.. We lived in Show Low, Arizona and I went back to school in Tucson to become an architect. In California I received a theology certificate for 4 years of study with the Magi Temple in Paradise, California.

At the University of Arizona, Tucson I graduated Cum Laude and other various accolades. I focused on sustainable green architecture at a time when no one

was discussing the issue of climate change. I studied art, architecture, theology of ancient Mexico. While in Tucson I practiced some of the ancient Toltec mindfulness techniques.

Once I graduated, I moved to San Antonio, Texas and worked for one of the largest and oldest firms in Texas- Ford, Powell & Carson. Here I interned and gained my registration as an architect and as a LEED ap (green certificate). LEED stands for Leaders in Environmental Energy Design – U.S. Green Builders – AP is Approved Professional. During my stay in Texas, I purchased a small cattle ranch and built a Gold LEED home and offices on the property where I ran my own Design Build firm for 10 years. Also, received my reverend certification here and married about 30 couples at the ranch.

Tired of the snakes I sold the ranch and everything that went with it and moved to Kona, Hawaii. Here I enjoyed an interesting time working on a large development on the Big Island. After 4 years of study in Texas and Hawaii I became a certified Kriya Yogi with the International Self Realization Fellowship. When the pandemic hit, I moved back to the mainland and while everyone was in lock down, I was driving around. In Montana I was prodded by a good friend to see the Oregon Coast again. I drove straight through to Florence, love, love, love the coast.

There were two other times in my life when I was approached by other people to move to Coos Bay. It took 40 years I'm so glad I made it! I work at an old architecture firm here in Coos Bay called Crow & Clay. Mike Crow retired last year so I was a good fit to help with the workload. I enjoy long distance travel, my theology studies, meditation, gardening & helping with Zonta!



Why Zonta? Helping women and girls, as I have been helped, is a wonderful opportunity, along with the great company of wonderful gals & 2 guys!

We've received our first few completed applications for our scholarships. ## **Building a Better world for Women and Girls**

The club has received applications from four local nonprofits focusing on environmental issues – their choice this year for granting the Community 101 dollars from Oregon Community Foundation. They have \$5,000 from OCF and an additional amount from their own earnings which they can contribute. The club also has the option of granting up to \$1,000 from the OCF funds to local school programs – and they have selected the Millicoma Marsh and the vegetable gardens at Madison School as possibilities. The nonprofits are Coos Watershed, Friends of South Slough, Rogue Climate and Wild Rivers Trust. The club members will be scheduling speakers from each program or taking field trips, as appropriate, before making their decisions.

The club is also required to do a mission-based service project (which this year means the environment!) and due to various schedule complications they have not yet voted on which project of the ones members have proposed will be selected. And we are beginning to be short on time!

We were pleased to welcome our Zonta member MARIA GONZALEZ-SANTOS as a career speaker in February – sorry too much going on at that meeting to get a photo – but she was outstanding – what an interesting life

she has had!
