


January Is Amelia Earhart Month By Joan Knapp South Puget Sound Zonta

January 11th of every year - Zonta International celebrates the historic 1935 flight that Zontian Amelia Earhart flew from Honolulu, Hawaii to Oakland, California. This was the first solo flight ever from Hawaii to California though others had tried and tragically failed. Thankfully she didn't have any mechanical or weather problems.

In fact, she listened to a radio broadcast of the Metropolitan Opera in flight and enjoyed hot chocolate and a few snacks on her 18-hour flight. Not only was this a ground-breaking flight, but she also earned \$10,000 from Hawaii businesses that promoted the idea.

Earhart was a Zontian from 1928 until her untimely death in 1937, first a member of the Zonta Club of Boston, then a member of the New York club. She epitomized the ideals of Zonta by actively encouraging women to take on non-traditional roles, to aspire, to pursue their dreams.



Tracy and I married in 2000, after 26 years together. This May we celebrate our 25th wedding anniversary, 51 years total. We love travel- mostly cruising now. 
